Home Is Where The Heart Is – Or Is It???
The Intersection of Psychotherapy and Immigration
Presenter: Linda McEvatt, LCSW

More than one third of the New York City population is foreign born. When working clinically with someone from a foreign country, it is critical to validate the impact of dislocation from the patient's country of origin. Whether an international executive on a temporary assignment in the United States or a refugee escaping from danger and oppression, the dislocation from the patient's home country will be clinically significant. Moreover, these patients are often at the mercy of the US immigration laws and suffer from the inefficiencies inherent in the government agencies who oversee immigration processing.

Linda McEvatt, LCSW will discuss some cases where she has successfully worked with patients whose immigration status had a huge impact on their emotional state, compounding the trauma so often associated with living away from their home country in the first place. Prior to launching her psychotherapy practice, Linda was a legal professional in the field of immigration law for more than 15 years. Linda (who is Irish born) is a psychotherapist in private practice in New York City and Upstate New York's Hudson Valley where she works with adults, many of whom have an international background. She is a graduate of the Training Institute's program in Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy.
