Applying Theories of Intersubjectivity and Attachment to Therapeutic Alliance Issues In Psychotherapy

As psychoanalytic theory continues to develop, two interrelated theories have emerged that significantly enhance clinical effectiveness. Attachment theory concerns physical and emotional proximity and bonding as regulators of affect states.

Intersubjectivity theory concerns experiences of mutual influence, mutual recognition, and empathic attunement as important interactional contributions to attachment security, self-coherence, and attachment styles.

This workshop will explore how the convergence of theories of intersubjectivity, attachment theory, and Infant Research interactive-regulation

theory can be applied to maintaining and restoring the therapeutic or working alliance.

The focus will be on how a patient's and a therapist's attachment styles and subjective organizing principles affect ones capacity to reflect upon and jointly construct meaning. These differences in style can cause fluctuations and ruptures in the working alliance.

Recent theories of "mentalization," "now moments," attachment security, and "intersubjective anxiety" will be applied to related clinical material.

The workshop will consist of lecture, clinical material, and film clips to illustrate this process. Participation is encouraged by workshop attendees.

Marc Wayne, CSW, BCD is a training analyst, faculty member, and senior supervisor at the Postgraduate Center for Mental Health, The Object Relations Institute for Psychoanalysis, and the Training Institute for Mental Health. He was chairman of the Training Committee at the Object Relations Institute, and Director of Supervision at the Bronx Center for Community Services. He has extensive experience working with individuals suffering from PTSD and was a member of the Trauma Response Team of the Training Institute following the 9/11 attack. He has conducted numerous professional workshops and classes at training institutes and hospitals on the treatment of schizoid states, multi-modal approaches to annihilation anxiety and disillusionment, self-psychology, and infant research theory. Marc Wayne has a private practice in psychoanalysis and supervision in Manhattan.
